

IB at Blindern vgs

- ✓ The first publicly owned school to offer the Diploma Programme in Norway (from 1978; 10 years after the introduction of the Programme by the IBO)
- ✓ The first publicly owned school to offer Middle Year Programme 4&5 in Norway (from 2016; 23 years after the introduction of the Programme by the IBO).
- ✓ The Middle Years Programme was authorized in June 2019.
- ✓ The Middle Years Programme at Blindern was approved as a 4-year trail by the Directorate of Education (2016/17). The trial was renewed in 2020



As of August 2023, there were over 8,000 programmes being offered worldwide, across over 5,700 schools in 159 countries.

Assessment in MYP

- All subject grades are awarded based on internal assessment
- The Personal Project is moderated by the IB (external assessment)
- Assessment: formative and summative
- Each subject has 4 main objectives, for example:

LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE:

A: Analyzing, B: Organizing,

C: Producing text, D: Language

MATHEMATICS:

A: Knowing and understanding, B: Investigating

patterns, C: Communicating, D: Applying mathematics

in real-life contexts

The Personal Project

Students in MYP5 select a topic of personal interest and create a product to achieve a goal that they have dedicated themselves to. This process is called the Personal Project.

The process (which involves investigation, planning, action and reflection) will be recorded in a final report that is to be submitted in March. The report will demonstrate how they have addressed each of the four objectives of the project.

"Through the Personal Project, students experience the responsibility of completing a significant piece of work over an extended period of time, as well as the need to reflect on their learning and the outcomes of their work."

Social and Learning Environment

«VIP-companionship»

- ✓ Build a good class environment
- ✓ Be a good 'colleague'
- ✓ Companions: Groups of 4
- ✓ Exchange phone numbers, collaborate on school work, be attentive of one another



Our six rules at Blindern

- 1. Be punctual for lessons
- 2. Come to lessons prepared and with all necessary materials
- 3. Always deliver work on time
- 4. Maintain focus on your subjects and be orderly during lessons
- 5. Leave classrooms tidy and keep the School clean
- 6. Be friendly and respectful of your fellow pupils and the School's staff



What does this mean for MYP students?

Be punctual for lessons

- Arriving after class has started: note (anmerkning)
- Arriving more than 15 minutes late: marked absent for 45 minutes



Absenteeism regulations for MYP5 and Diploma programme

- The rules are to be found in the regulations to the Education Act §3-3 last paragraph and the regulations to the Private schools Act §3-3 last paragraph.
- Students in upper secondary school shall attend and participate actively in all planned school activities.
- If a student has more than 10 percent undocumented absence in a subject this will lead to the loss of a right to a term grade or final/end of year evaluation in that subject. The teacher will be unable to award a grade in that subject.
- The student must produce relevant documentation to have their absence exempt from this rule.



Absenteeism regulations for MYP5 and Diploma programme (2)

- If a student has between 10 and 15 percent undocumented absence and the cause of that absence makes it unreasonable that the student should not receive a grade, the Principal may according to the circumstances decide that a grade be awarded. If the undocumented absence exceeds 15 percent in the subject no grade will be awarded.
- The absenteeism percent is valid for an individual subject, not the student's overall absence.
- The student shall receive a letter of warning that they are in danger of not gaining a grade in the particular subject.



What does this mean for MYP students?

Come to class prepared and with all necessary materials

- Always includes pen/pencil, notebook, computer and subject material (textbook, handouts, novel, gym clothes etc).
- ■Place mobile phone in cubby/box before class starts, and before washing hands

If you fail to follow these instructions, you will get a note (anmerkning)



What does this mean for MYP students?

Always deliver work on time

- Work delivered after deadline will not be assessed (unless legitimate reason and previous arrangement with teacher)
- Deadlines will be set no later than 8 pm
- As a student you must make sure you participate in assessment tasks to fulfill the requirements of MYP assessment needed to receive a grade in each subject.



Absence Procedures at Blindern

Planned absence: **Parents** and students notify the contact teacher in advance. Arrange with each subject teacher to catch up with any work you will miss due to the absence.

If sick: **Parents** must send an email to the contact teacher on the day of the absence (and each following day)

Students check itslearning and/or classmates to catch up on school work
