- *First DP cohort enrolled in 1978 and graduated in 1980*
- *The first MYP cohort started in 2016*
- *Today 162 pupils will enrol in one of the two IB Programmes we offer*

# IB at Blindern vgs

- ✓ *The first publicly owned school to offer the Diploma Programme in Norway (from 1978; 10 years after the introduction of the Programme by the IBO)*
- ✓ *The first publicly owned school to offer Middle Year Programme 4&5 in Norway (from 2016; 22 years after the introduction of the Programme by the IBO ).*
- ✓ *The Middle Years Programme was authorized in June 2019.*

- ✓ In August/September 2020, at 1358 schools in 108 countries MYP 4 and 5 students are about to start a new academic year



- ✓ In May 2020: 170,278 graduates - 152 countries - 3421 schools

- ✓ Today there are more than 1.95 millions of DP Graduates around the world

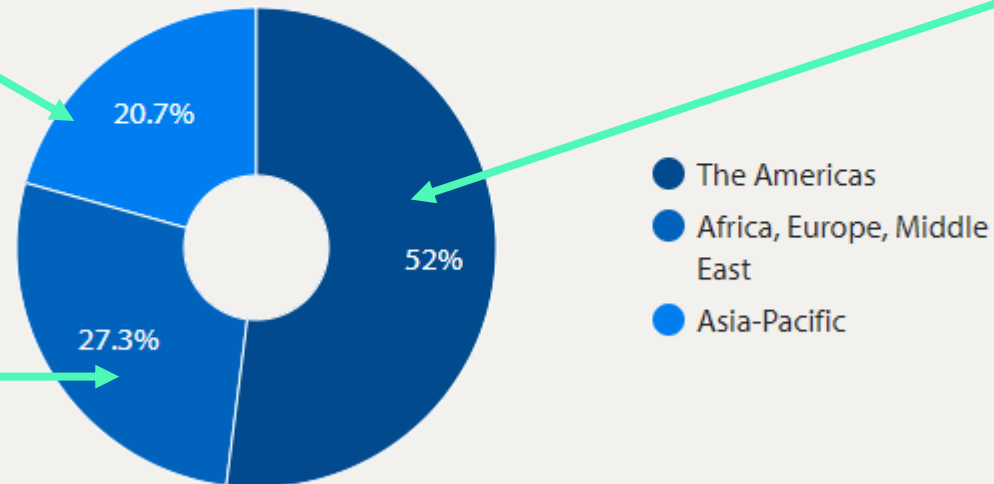
# Number of schools offering the IB Programmes around the world

# Teaching and Learning in the IB

- No prescribed syllabus
- Key concepts: the starting point – tie *what* we learn to a larger idea
- Global context: how is what we are learning relevant in the world? *Why* are we learning what we are learning?
- Developing skills such as *reading, writing, analyzing, investigating, organizing, time management* etc.
- Service component

# Assessment in MYP

- All subject grades are awarded based on internal assessment
- Assessment: formative and summative
- Each subject has 4 main objectives, for example:

## **LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE:**

A: Analyzing, B: Organizing,  
C: Producing text, D: Language

## **MATHEMATICS:**

A: Knowing and understanding, B: Investigating  
patterns, C: Communicating, D: Applying mathematics  
in real-life contexts

# Assessment in MYP

Example of feedback to students through descriptions of Achievement Levels

Ind & Soc – Criterion D: Thinking critically  
iv Interpret different perspectives and their implications

Achievement level	Level descriptors
0	The student <b>does not</b> reach a standard described by any of the descriptors below.
1-2	The student: iv <b>identifies</b> different perspectives and <b>minimal</b> implications
3-4	The student: iv <b>interprets</b> different perspectives and <b>some</b> of their implications
5-6	The student: iv <b>interprets</b> different perspectives and their implications
7-8	The student: iv <b>thoroughly interprets</b> a <b>range</b> of different perspectives and their implications

# Our six rules at Blindern

1. Be punctual for lessons
2. Come to lessons prepared and with all necessary materials
3. Always deliver work on time
4. Maintain focus on your subjects and be orderly during lessons
5. Leave classrooms tidy and keep the School clean

# What does this mean for MYP students?

## **Be punctual for lessons**

- Arriving after class has started: note (anmerkning)
- Arriving more than 15 minutes late: marked absent for 45 minutes

# What does this mean for MYP students?

## **Come to class prepared and with all necessary materials**

- Always includes pen/pencil, notebook, computer and subject material (textbook, handouts, novel, gym clothes etc).
- Place mobile phone in cubby/box before class starts, and before washing hands

# What does this mean for MYP students?

## Always deliver work on time

- Work delivered after deadline will not be assessed (unless legitimate reason and previous arrangement with teacher)
- Deadlines will be set no later than 8 pm
- As a student you must make sure you participate in assessment tasks to fulfill the requirements of MYP assessment needed to receive a grade in each subject.

# Absence Procedures at Blindern

✓ There is a time for school and there is a time for holidays. We follow the "Skoleruta"

- ✓ In the rare cases of planned absence: you notify the contact teacher in advance. You arrange with each subject teacher to catch up with any work you will miss due to the absence. If applicable, you provide a justification for documented absence.
- ✓ If sick: **Parents** must send an email to the contact teacher on the day of the absence (and each following day)
- ✓ Automated notification of absence
- ✓ Students check itslearning and/or classmates to catch up on school work
