Applicants must have a registered address in Oslo municipality by the application deadline, which is 1st of March 2017.

Applicants who are in the process of moving to Oslo are eligible to apply for a place. They will, however, not secure a place until they provide documentation to prove that they have moved to an Oslo address together with or in order to join their parent(s)/legal guardians before the start of the school year. **The deadline for providing documentation is the 23rd of June.**

N.B. Students **must** have a registered address in Oslo municipality throughout the time they attend the school.
